• A current academic or clinical appointment at University of Calgary - includes professorial ranks (assistant, associate, or full professor), instructional ranks (instructor lecturer, senior instructor), clinical appointments

- Eligible for all HBI and/or Mathison Centre support programs and resources, including:
 - Graduate studentships and postdoctoral and clinical fellowships
 - Support and funding for use of all HBI-run Platforms, including the Molecular Core, the Advanced Microscopy Platform (AMP), the CSM Optogenetics facility, the Non-invasive Neurostimulation Network (N3), the NeuroImaging Research Unit, the MR-guided Focused Ultrasound, and RESTORE.
